



Oskaloosa Main Street applied for and was awarded \$69,000 to help Jaarsma Bakery with their renovations to their new location in the Main Street District.








- Partnered with Oskaloosa Community Schools to clean up downtown and neighboring streets

- Partnered with 4H Garfield Boosters to paint flower bed trim





curriculum for area schools.








SE CONNECTOR AND MODES

RAIL STUDY


